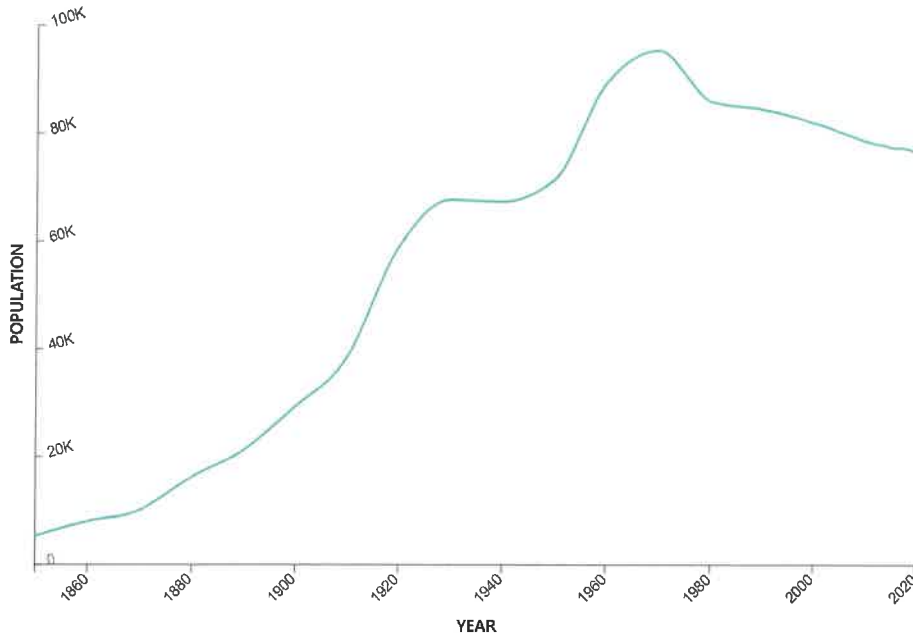

The current population of Racine, Wisconsin is **76,130**, based on our projections of the latest US Census estimates. The US Census estimates the 2018 population at **77,075**. The last official US Census in 2010 recorded the population at **78,860**.

Racine is a city located in [Wisconsin](#). With a 2020 population of **76,130**, it is the **5th largest city in Wisconsin** (after [Milwaukee](#), [Madison](#), [Green Bay](#), and [Kenosha](#)) and the **472nd largest city in the United States**. Racine is currently declining at a rate of **-0.41%** annually and its population has decreased by **-3.46%** since the most recent census, which recorded a population of **78,860** in 2010. Racine reached its highest population of 95,162 in 1970. Spanning over 16 miles, Racine has a population density of 4,920 people per square mile.

The average household income in Racine is \$56,574 with a poverty rate of 20.99%. The median rental costs in recent years comes to \$831 per month, and the median house value is \$108,700. The median age in Racine is 34.7 years, 33 years for males, and 35.8 years for females. For every 100 females there are 97.2 males.

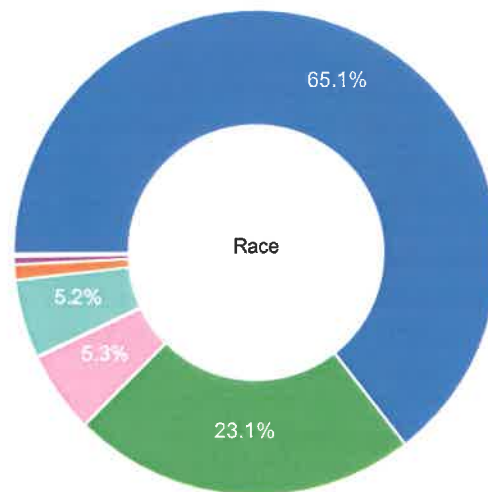

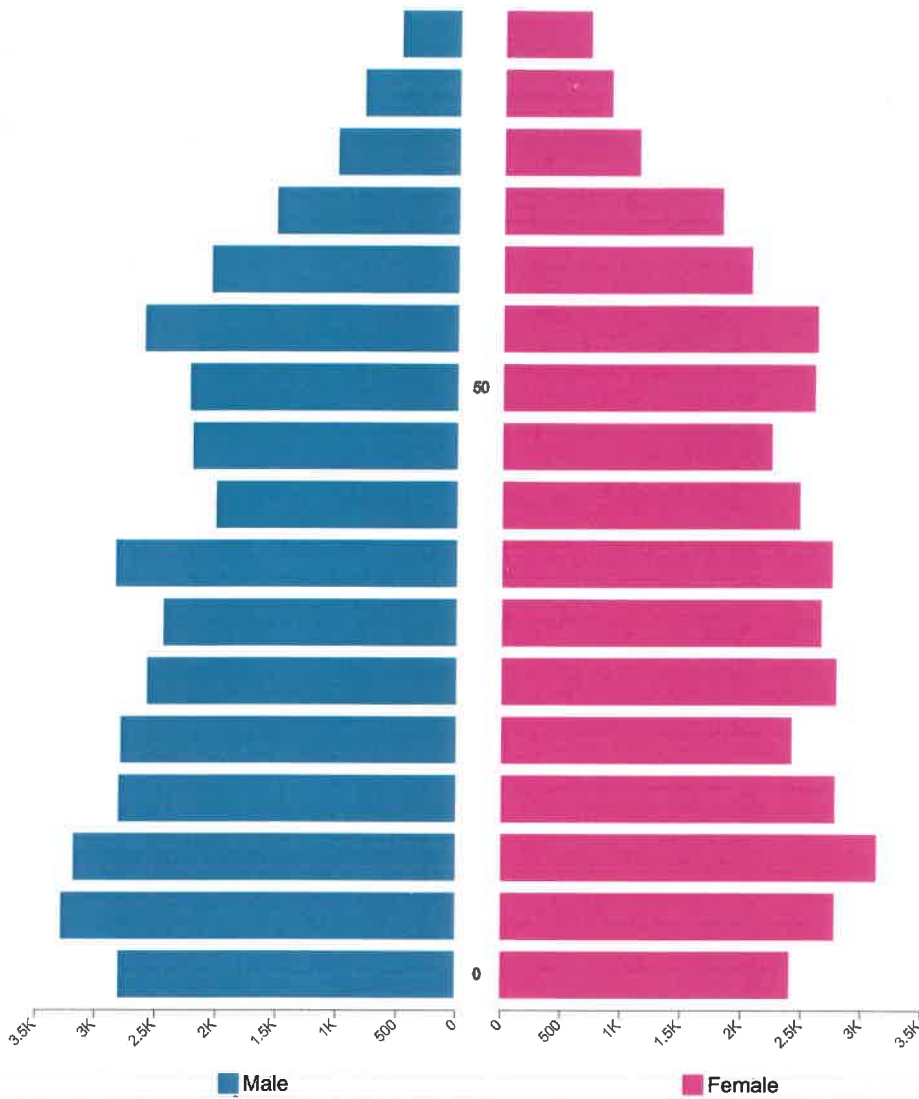

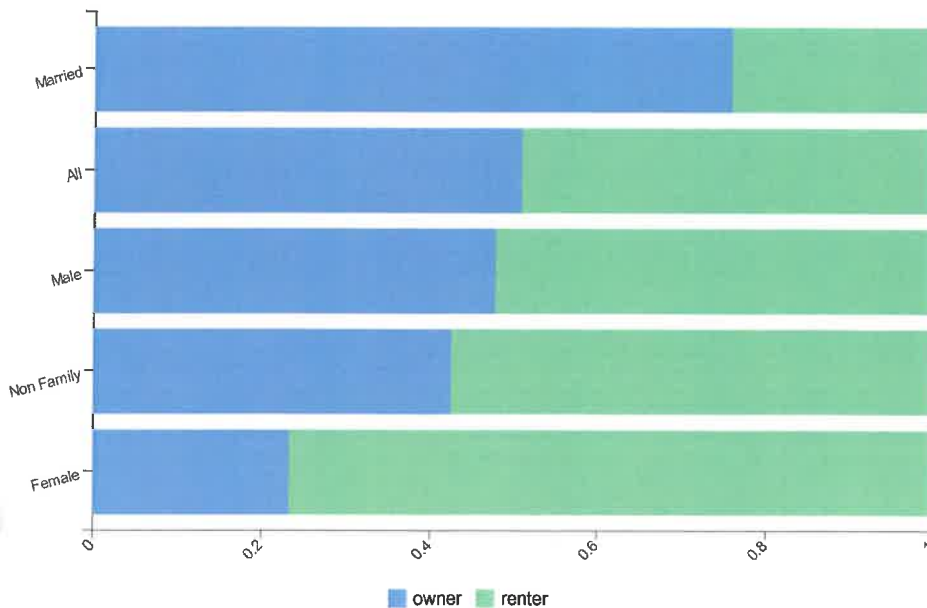

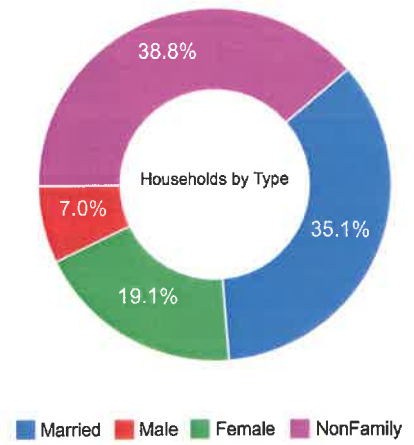

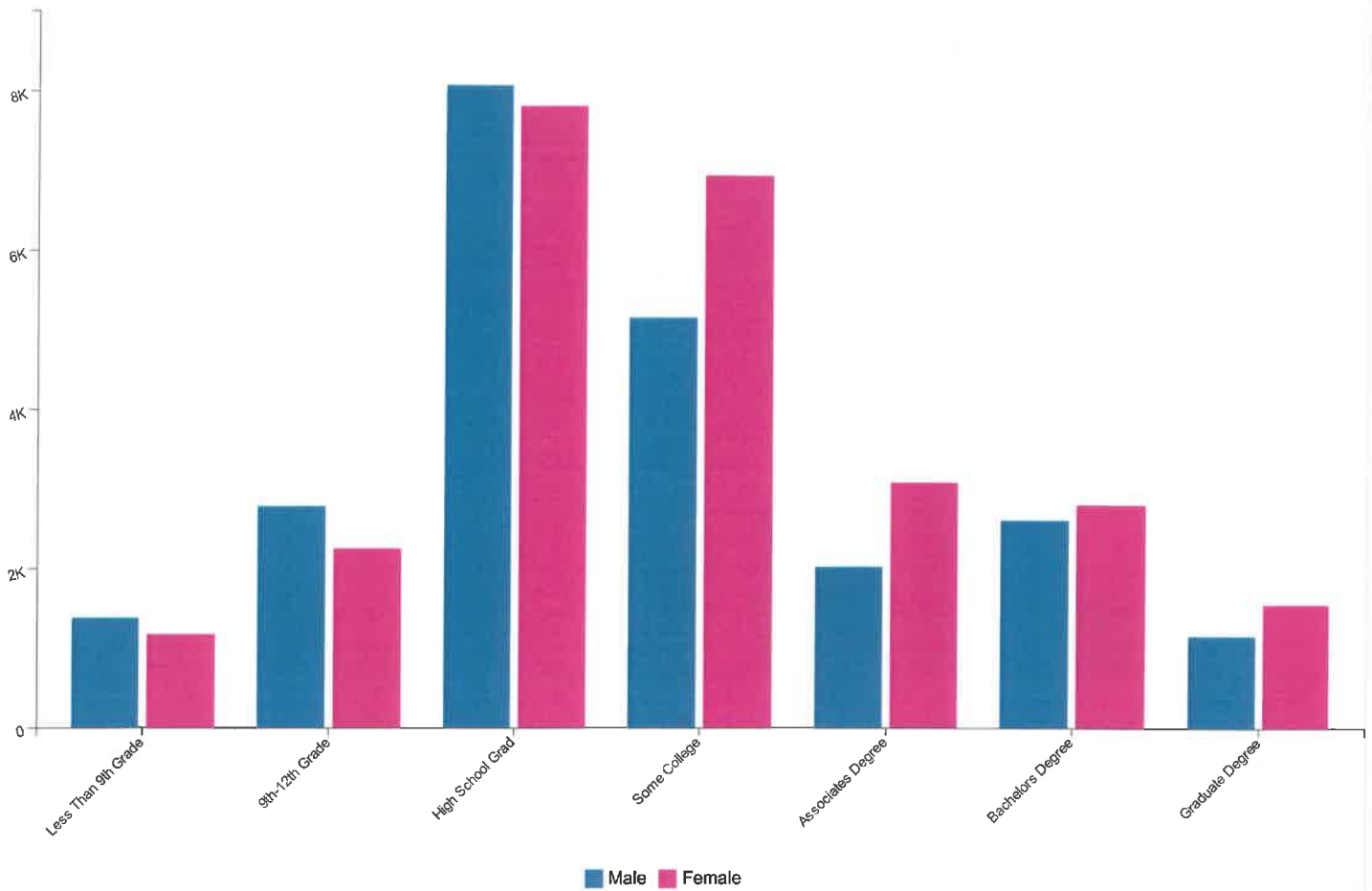

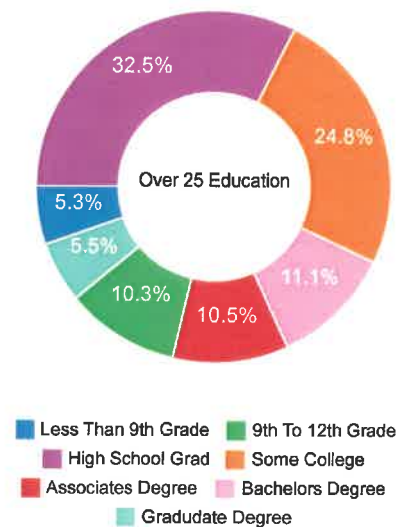

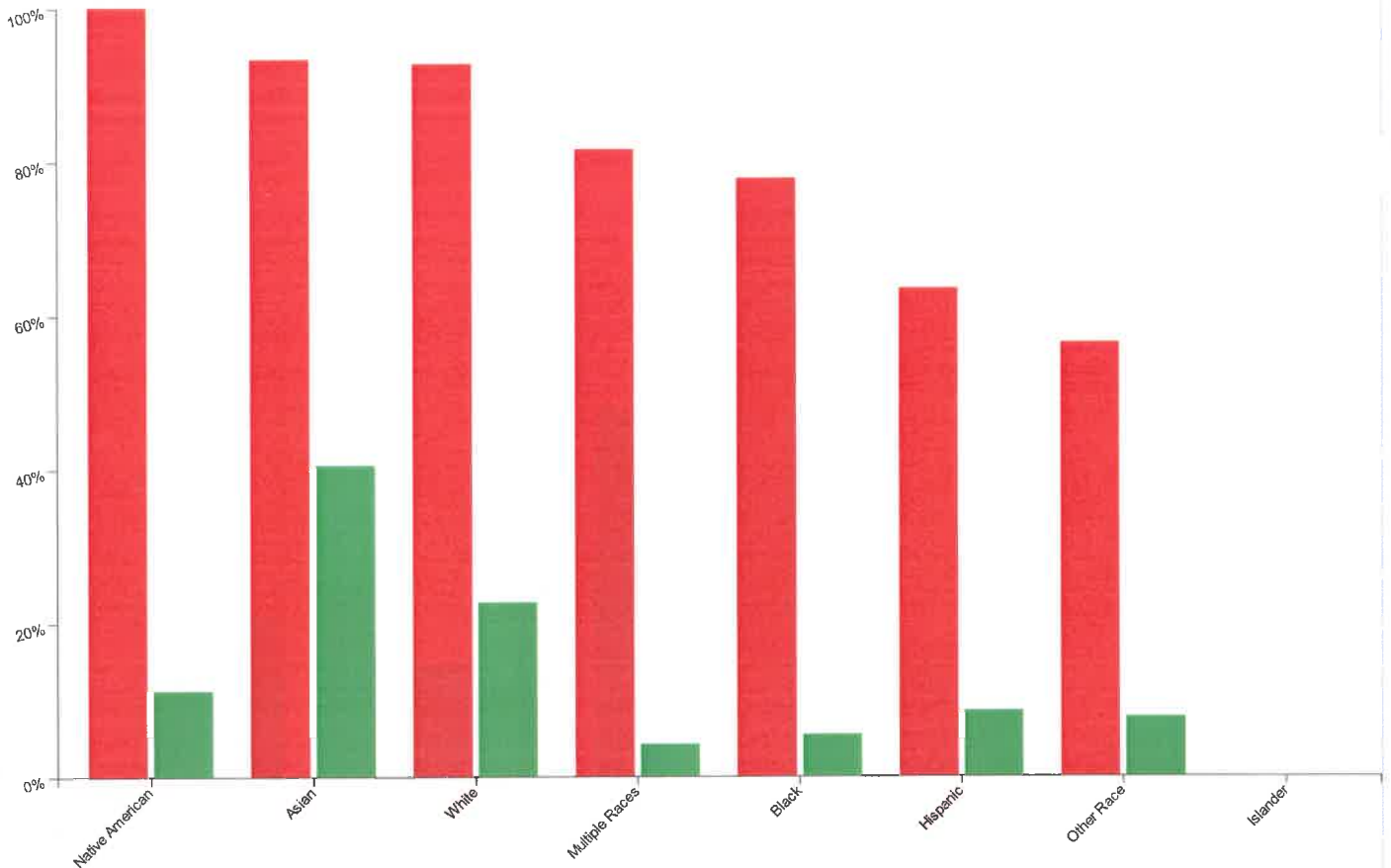

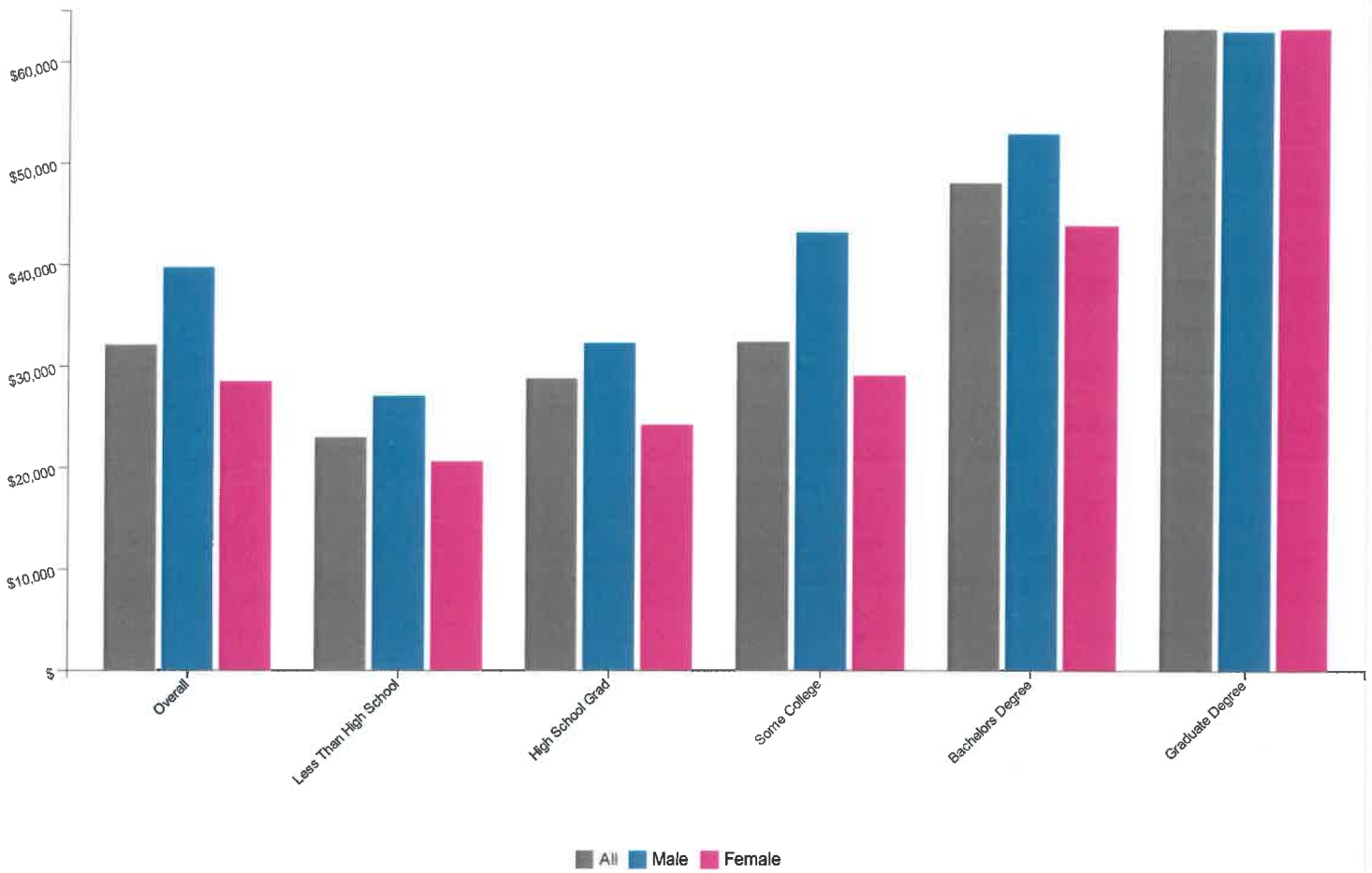

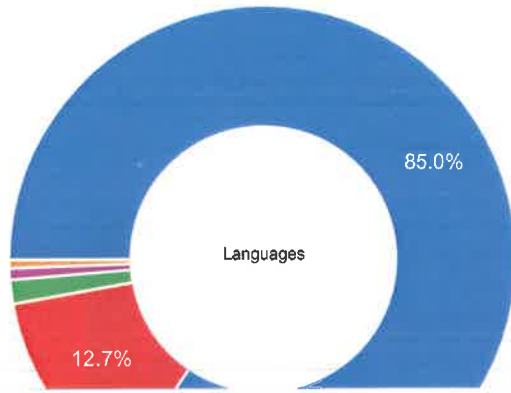

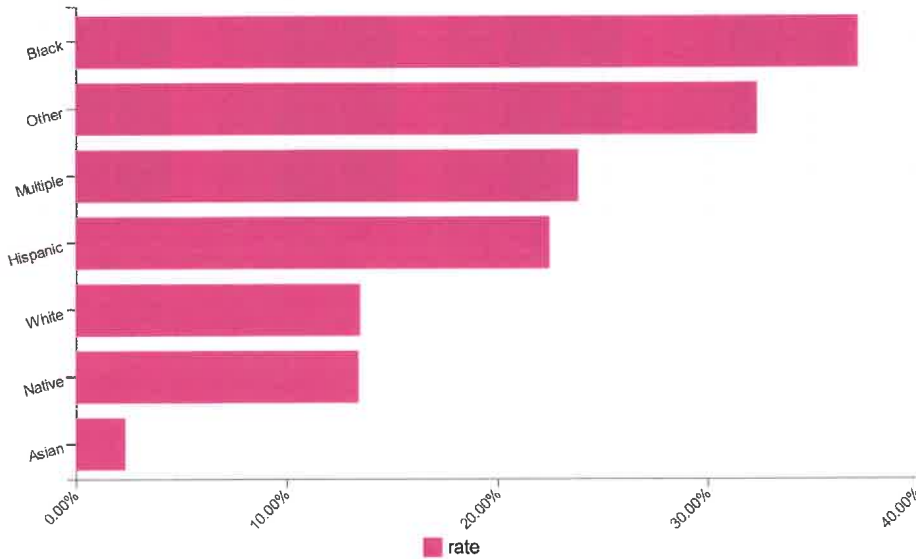

The poverty rate among those that worked full-time for the past 12 months was 4.96%.

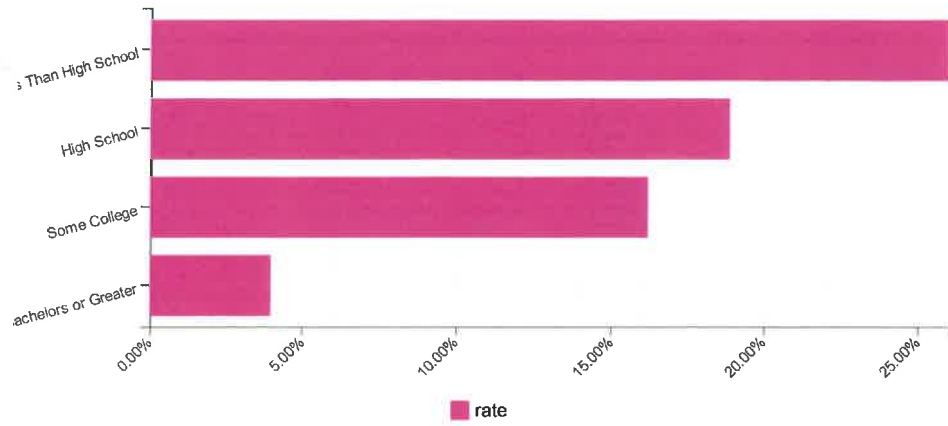
Among those working part-time, it was 22.21%, and for those that did not work, the poverty rate was 30.16%.

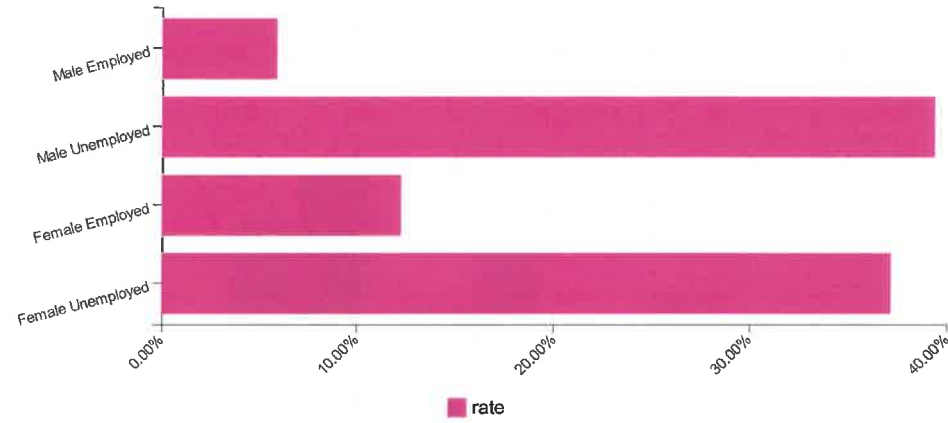

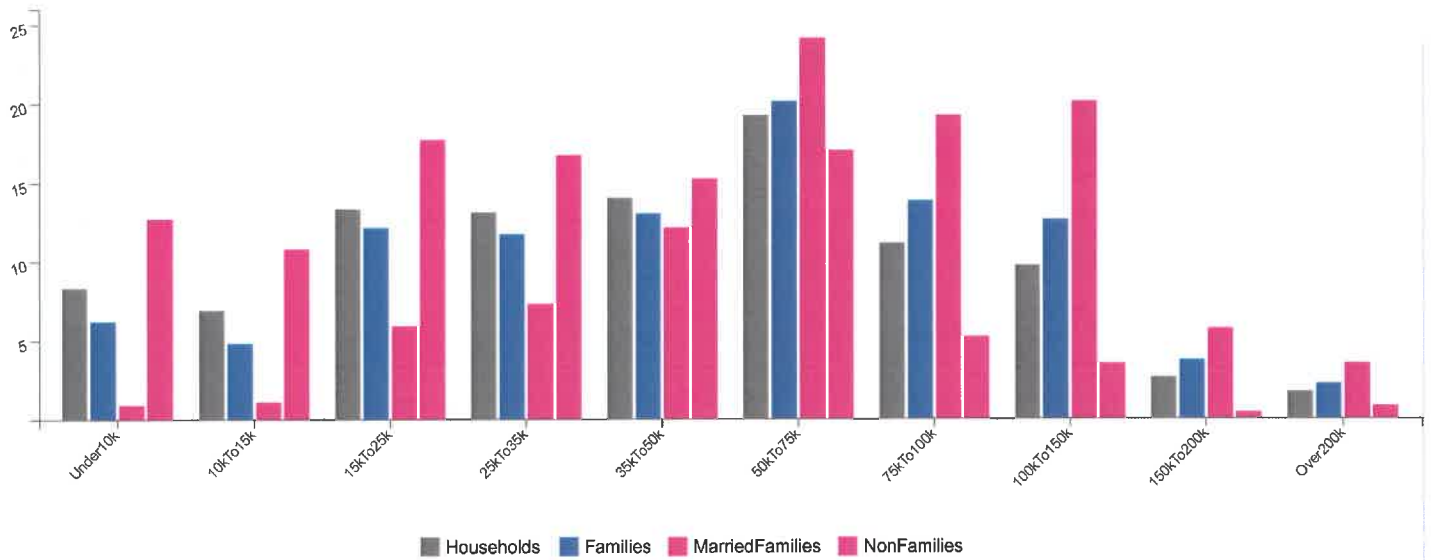

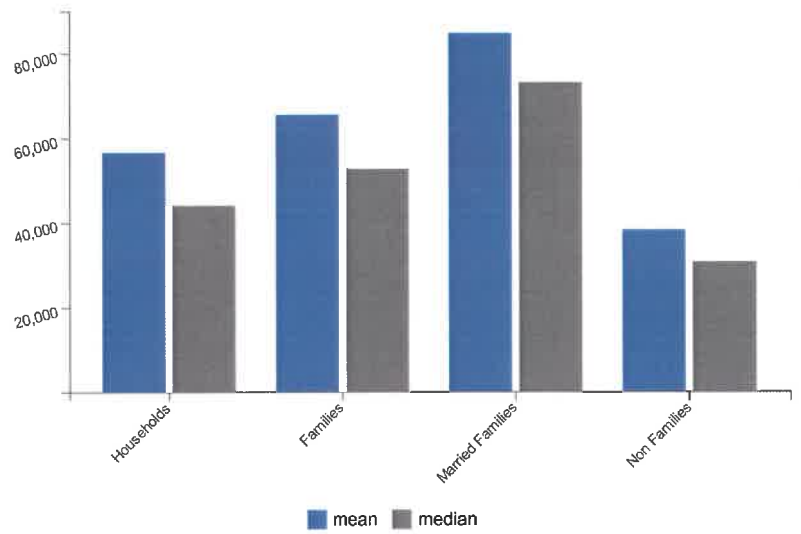

### Racine Income by Household Type



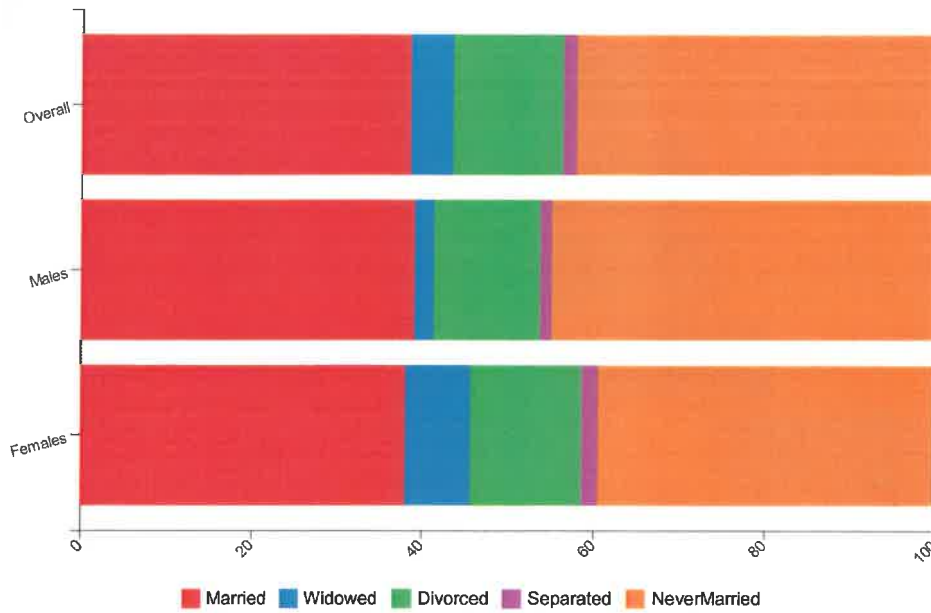

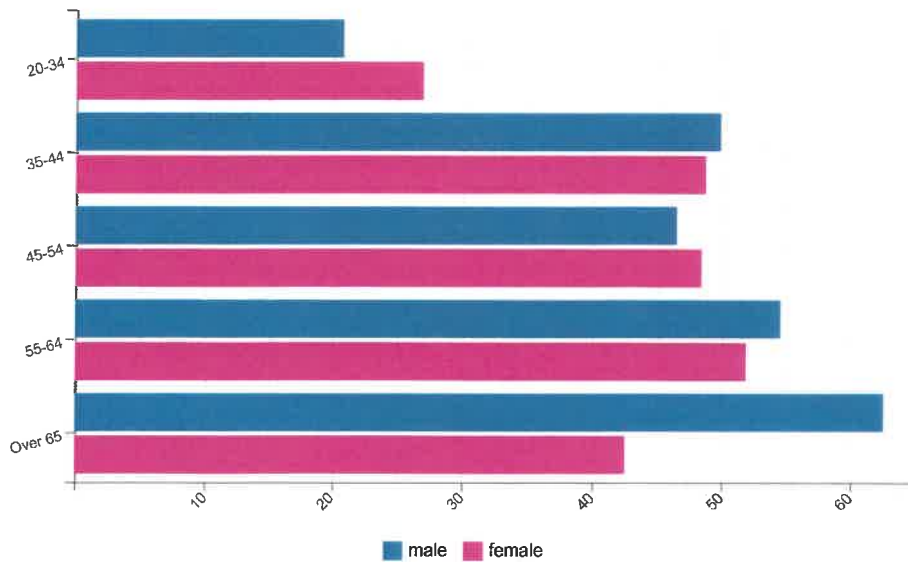

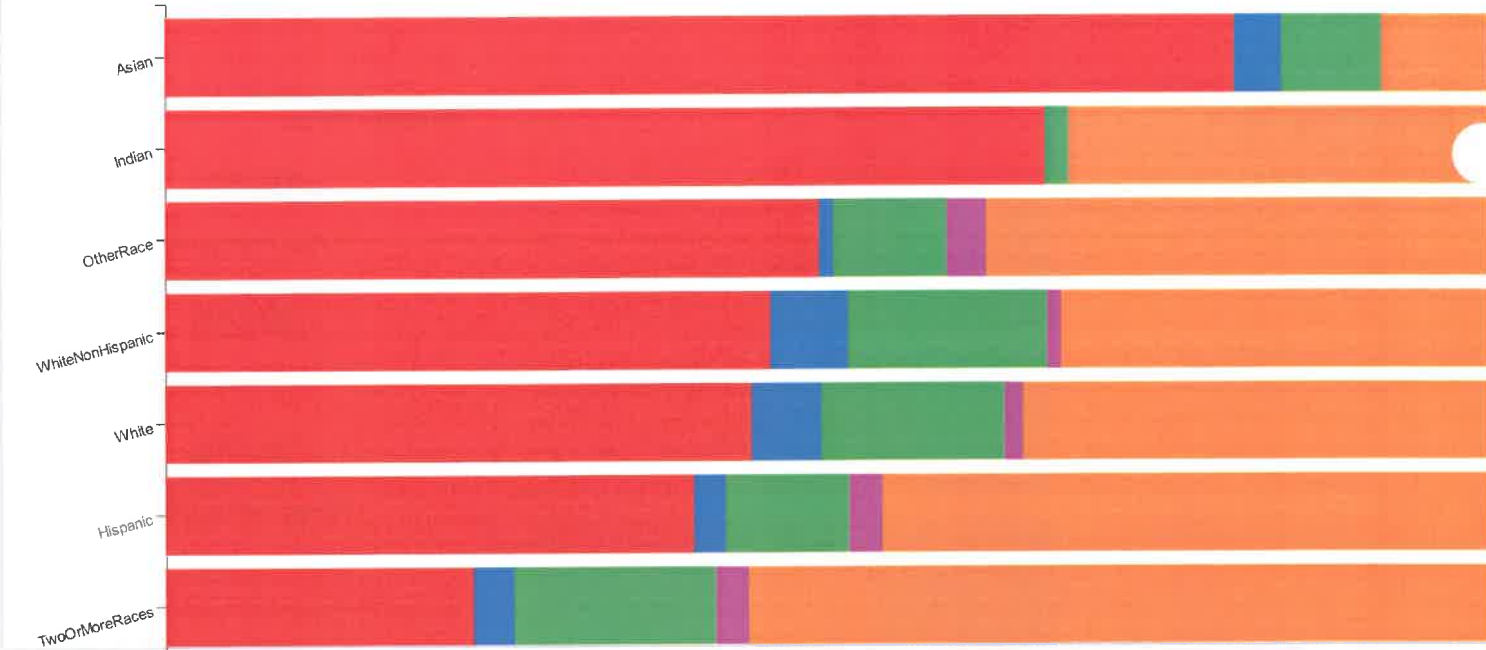
Racine Married by Age and Sex

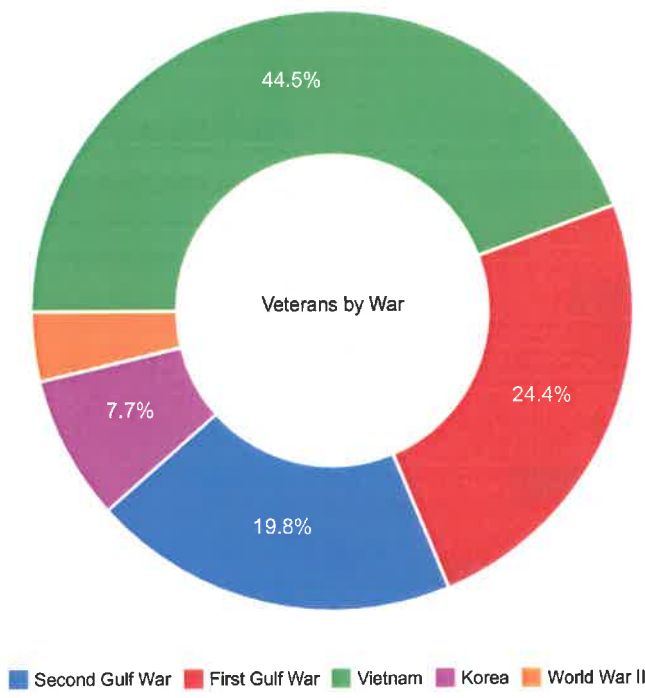
The age group where males are most likely to be married is Over 65, while the female age group most likely to be married is 55-64.

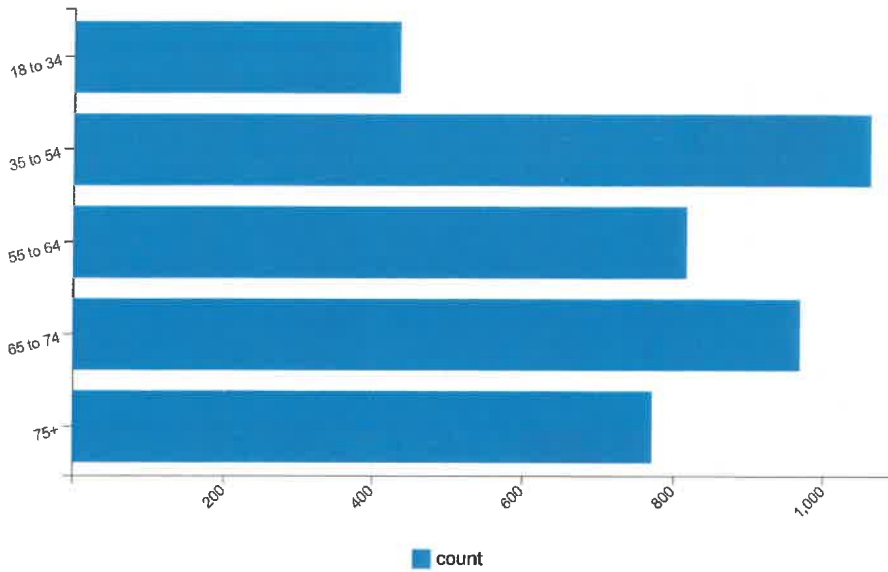

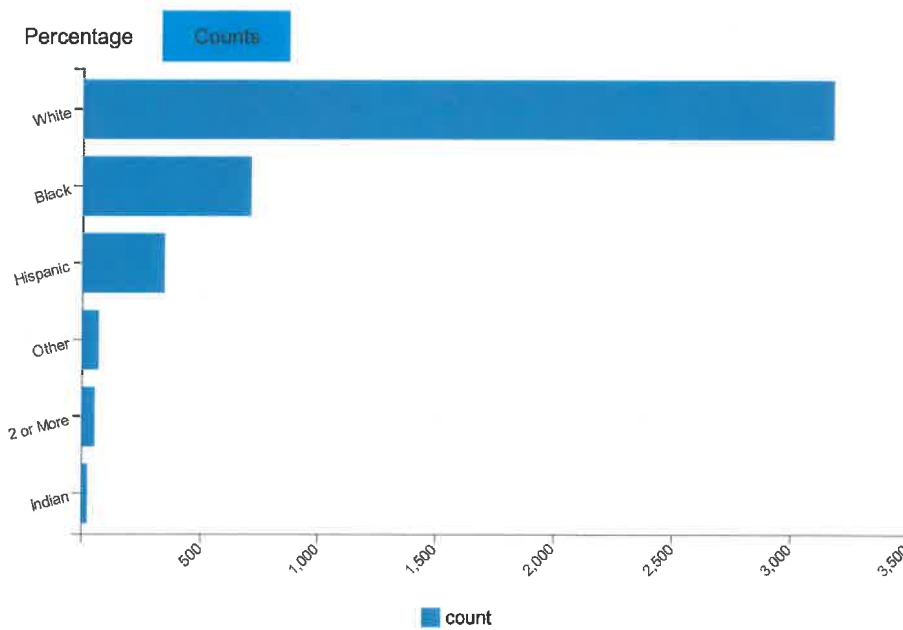

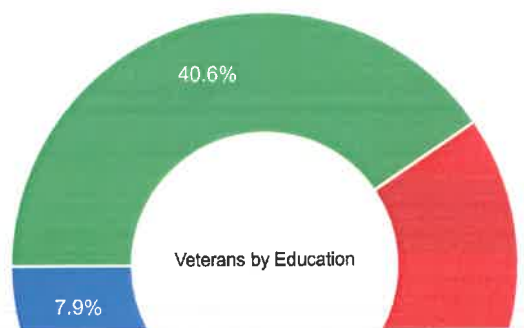

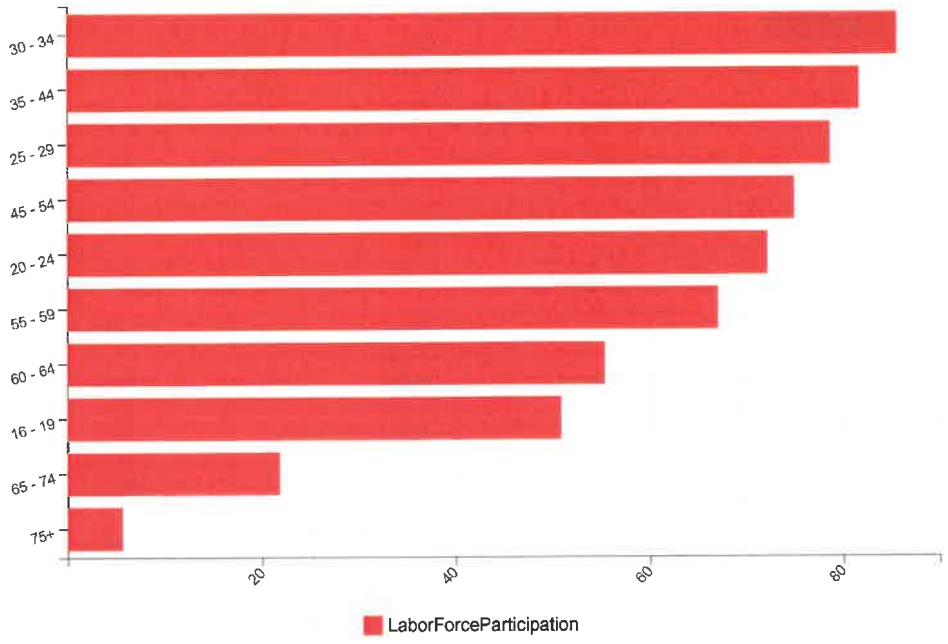

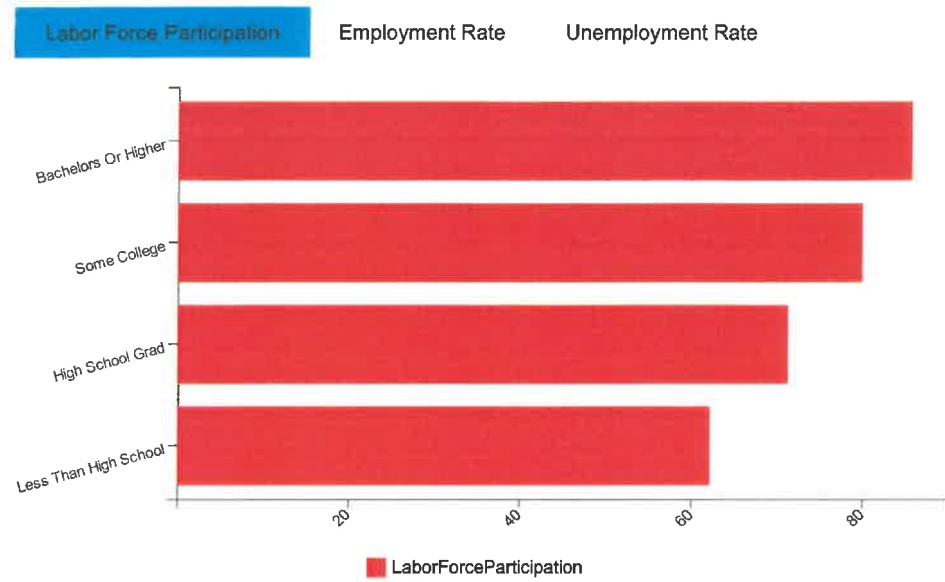

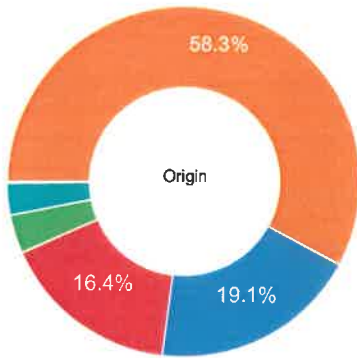
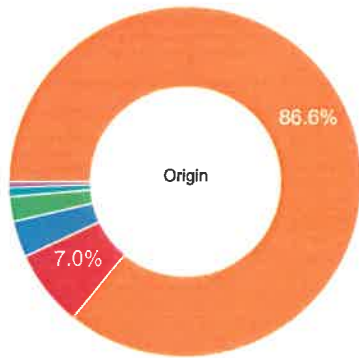
