

At Calvary . . . with Pastor Davis

I am writing this on election day — not knowing the outcome (and being quite comfortable with that). I am not writing any of this prophetically, but I have been thinking about our nation while reflecting upon the period of the judges as recorded in the book of Judges. It is interesting to note how the appointed judge was, in ways, a reflection of the people. In our democratic republic, individual votes cast, when put together become an indication of the heart of the nation — that being the expressed will of the people. You will be more willing or less willing to identify with our elected official depending on the outcome of the different political races. If you have been waving the flag for one candidate or another, you will be gratified or despondent — entirely based upon whether things went your way.

In studying for this next Sunday, I marvel how the Spirit of God uses the Word of God to speak to a vast range of situations we experience in life. Not that I ever doubted this to be case, I am increasingly amazed by the sufficiency of Scripture. It truly does speak to every realm of life and imparts God's wisdom. Our individual identity will either rise and fall with a candidate, or it will be surely founded on who you are as a child of God, whose future home is settled and sure, and God is on the throne regardless of the blips of life. Such a perspective should carry with it little expectation that everything in this life is going to go "my way" — all prosperity and free from suffering and even persecution.

Consider these words of our Savior from Matthew 7

²⁴ "Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock: ²⁵ and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and heat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock.

²⁶ "But everyone who hears these sayings of Mine, and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand: ²⁷ and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it fell. And great was its fall."

²⁸ And so it was, when Jesus had ended these sayings, that the people were astonished at His teaching, ²⁹ for He taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes.

In our presumptions, let us learn to not anchor them in our own wishful thinking, but in the sure promises of God as we allow His Spirit to do His work in each of us to conform us to the image of His dear Son — which is in no way contingent upon who sits in those important seats in D.C. Let us pray for our leaders and live as people whose faith is in God.
