At Calvary . . . with Pastor Davis

My heart has been greatly affected by my studying of history for today's message — thinking of the things the people of that time endured, and seeing so clearly the same difficulties in our day. The troubling subject was learning about the pressures applied to the Jewish people to be Hellenized — to be absorbed into Greek culture, to be made Greek rather than Jewish — in life, lifestyle, and in faith. The pressures were both forthright and subtle. The forthright pressures were more obvious, with a clearer picture of the deviation from what the people knew was right or wrong. The subtle pressures were, in many ways, more effective and more devastating for, if

yielding to the appeal to compromise, the individual would be eaten up from within by their own conscience.

The Greek gymnasium was an imposing structure that communicated rather strongly who was in charge. It was also a central hub for the men to interact. I imagine it to be the place where big business deals were struck, where the movers and shakers operated. Participation was compulsory in some ways — for those who were considered acceptable — and in that way, there was the appeal of wanting to be involved and included rather than be excluded and deemed undesirable. It is not hard to imagine the draw, because we feel the same pull quite regularly. On its face, the setting seems harmless enough — a focus on physical exercise and discipline — though there will be necessary compromises one would need to make in order to participate. Perhaps these would be compromises that seem trite to many — mere accommodations more than compromises, we reason. But for someone who knows God's law, he knows it is stepping outside of what is appropriate. The draw to be pleasing to men or pleasing to God especially when the presence of "the powers that be" seem so much more immediate, and, at the time, so much bigger! So, perhaps he acquiesces and goes to see what the fuss is all about. However, once inside, he finds there is more taking place than was advertised. Now he has seen more than he was expecting, and made connections with people who now think him one of them and a part of their circle with further expectations. Within himself, his conscience is gnawing at him and his compromise has ushered in immorality and any number of associations he wasn't necessarily pursuing from the outset.

So, what is he to do? Condemned by his own conscience, accusations from the accuser, and feeling stuck — like he has crossed a line from which he cannot return. Reasoning he is no longer a good Jew, but knowing it is well within his grasp to at least be a good Greek — though it would take him further down the road that torments his soul.

What is he to do? What are we to do (for this is a story of humanity, not just a Jew living in a Greek world). We fight. We repent. We come back. We fall, we get back up. We remember who we are. We remember Whose we are. We remind ourselves of what is true rather than believing the nagging lies that our past is our future. We turn around to find that the One that we left is right behind us, ready to forgive, to receive, and restore us. Turn around!
