At Calvary . . . with Pastor Davis

Last Sunday I was walking around with some of our students as we looked at the ongoing work on this giant window project — noting windows that we could not look through before and now brightly show the light. It was both fun and exciting to reflect upon these things together.

“We have a pretty church.” one said.
“We really do.” I replied.
“And our building is nice too.” he said, finishing his thought.

That interaction encouraged me tremendously and it has been running through my head much this week. I hope it receives the same reception with you.

It reminds me that we have a nice building that we do well to maintain as these walls, ceilings, and floors encourage much ministry and are used by many to be cared for and taught the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I think of Jon Patton and his work here, the Facilities Committee and their continual efforts, and the many folks who come by throughout the week to give attention to things that go unseen to most of us, and I am grateful.

I am reminded that the loveliness is not in the building alone — for it would be a travesty to have an attractive building, but an unlovely people. Though not mutually exclusive, the loveliness is to be seen more notably in the people. I am grateful that such a perspective was clearly communicated in the above statement. May that remain in focus here at Calvary Memorial Church among you who *are* Calvary Memorial Church — not the building, but the people. Thank you for your part in having our church be a good testimony of our God. Paul speaks about this cause and effect reality in **Philippians 2** in how Christ followers are a reflection of the One they follow. ¹⁴ *Do all things without complaining and disputing,* ¹⁵ *that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world,* ¹⁶ *holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain.* Clinging to, proclaiming, and living in accordance with *the word of life*.

I also wanted to thank the Missions Committee for their work in making arrangements for our Missions Conference theme throughout the summer (concluding today) with our *Come and See* Sundays. I thank you all for giving of your time and finances to support our missionaries.
