



At Calvary . . . with Pastor Davis

Brethren, pray for us.

This verse has been running through my head much these days.

It is an appeal, yes, but a *reasoned* appeal based upon relationship. Paul writes this speaking to his fellow believers. These are the ones with whom he would *expect* to have a receptive hearing. These are the ones whom it would be reasonably expected that they are thinking of him and desiring to hear from him. These are the ones he would expect to care. Hopefully this request serves as a reminder. It is a tender request from one who is regularly in unpleasant situations and doubtlessly wrestling with feeling alone — writing to loved ones, asking to be upheld (he, with his companions) in prayer.

Prayer is an interesting thing, if you think about it. When it comes down to it, we really are limited in our reach. Technology makes it so that we are usually not "unreachable" but that does not necessarily mean that we are "in touch" with one another. Even in the midst of accessibility through emails, texts, and video calls and keeping up by following one another's photo reels or online musings, these are not substitutions for prayer. In fact, these ones we pour over have an even greater need for our prayers than anything else. For prayer delivers round the clock access and is not hampered by our comparatively limited reach. It acknowledges the care of God and, in His sovereign plan, He uses our prayers, answering them in the care He provides. No one is beyond the reach of the omniscient God. So pray for a tender heart, for comfort, for provision, for protection, knowing the requests of the brethren do not fall on deaf ears with our Father in heaven. This verse is actually at the end of quite a list in 1st Thessalonians 5. They are instructions for us but also provide direction on the sorts of things for which we can pray. Check it out.

I would encourage you to pick up a copy of the Prayer Bulletin that sits on the ushers table in the foyer. These are helpful for reminding us of the ones for whom we must pray. Specifically, there are names there who are reliant upon – dare I say *expecting* – to be upheld by our prayers. May we be faithful to do so. Not just waiting for them to send out a request or an update, or to spontaneously come to our mind, but purposing to *put* them in our minds and then to pray for them.

I have also thought of how marked our lives are by distraction. I wonder, in all our connectivity, reminders, and access, if the phone in our pocket causes us to be more prayerful or if it makes us ever distracted and less likely to slow down and give time to prayer. It would be worth us giving that some consideration.
