

Prayer Bulletins are available at the Ushers’ table in the foyer. They are updated regularly as needed.

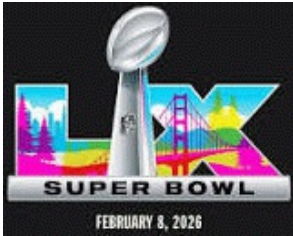
2025 Giving Statements—These have been mailed. Committee members will find their statements in their church mailboxes.

Contemplating nuggets from our CMC church family Bible reading:

Does it ever seem like messages in the Bible are contradictory?
Isn't it interesting to read the account of Job alongside Psalms – especially **Job 22** accompanied with **Psalms 15!**

¹ *Lord, who may abide in Your tabernacle?
Who may dwell in Your holy bill?*

² *He who walks uprightly,
And works righteousness,
And speaks the truth in his heart;*

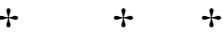
³ *He who does not backbite with his tongue,
Nor does evil to his neighbor,
Nor does he take up a reproach against his friend;*

⁴ *In whose eyes a vile person is despised,
But he honors those who fear the Lord;
He who swears to his own hurt and does not change;
⁵ He who does not put out his money at usury,
Nor does he take a bribe against the innocent.*

He who does these things shall never be moved.

So often we read such things and would ascribe to such an individual smooth sailing and a life free of trial of full of tangible blessing. It seems Eliphaz was presuming this and, when looking at Job’s sufferings, concluded Job had got himself into some wicked things to be getting what he reasoned to be some harsh comeuppance for serious wrongdoing. What trouble we get ourselves into in our thinking when we imagine we know what is transpiring behind the curtain, outside of our knowledge, beyond our sight, with our view, scope and perspective so very limited! Job’s *friends* became *accusers* when they tried to speak to what they did *not* know and then went further to draw *inaccurate* conclusions.

We can look at Job’s life falling apart around him and wonder what he did wrong. (And we can do the same contemplating our own life.) We can then look at **Psalms 15** and conclude that it does not work – or that it certainly did not work for Job. And then we remind ourselves that **Psalms 15** is answering a question. The question is not ‘how do you get all the pleasure and pleasantness out of this life?’ but *Lord, who may abide in your tabernacle? Who may dwell in Your holy bill?* The verses that follow speak of how such a blessed fellowship with God can be known. Even in the midst of his hurt and confusion, Job continued to live out such a life, honored the Lord, and, in that sense, we can confidently say that Job was an example of *He who does these things shall never be moved.*
