Chap. 10 - The Profane Fire of Nadab and Abihu

- “Worship must align with God's revealed will, not creativity that contradicts Scripture.”
 - “God's mercy never cancels His holiness; the cross proves both.”
 - “For 9 chapters, they did as He commanded, then one decision to do something their own way equaled disaster.”
- “All of Leviticus is a reminder that He wants us to take sin seriously and understand the cost.”

Chap. 16 “sheds light on the import of the Samuel/Eli and Zechariah experiences in the temple.”

20:23-24 - “You must not live according to the customs of the nations I am going to drive out before you. Because they did all these things, I abhorred them. But I said to you, “You will possess their land; I will give it to you as an inheritance, a land flowing with milk and honey.” I am the Lord your God, who has set you apart from the nations.
Paraphrase: Live differently from the world, I have set you apart!”

25:23 - “...the land is mind and you are but aliens and my tenants.’ A reminder to be good stewards of what is His.”

Chap. 26 - “In life struggles when we question or rebel and ask WHY? We already have the answer, ‘I am the Lord.’”

“We don't see a way to disregard the story of this book and still be fully involved in the teachings of the New Testament. Leviticus is a transformation from the significance of completing an easily forgotten act to gain approval from God into a constant, daily, more personal responsibility now expected of us to bring us to a state of never ending reliance on God's grace.

Leviticus is detailing the structure of symbolism and order for a Holy God to be near the sin in his people. It shows us how serious sin is to God and why these precautions needed to happen. We feel ourselves groan when we see the laundry list of rules and think of them as for hygiene or moral purposes that were always temporary. But they were put in place for God to be near us, until the final sacrifice was made by our Lord Jesus Christ. Again emphasizing the seriousness of sin, that God had to die.”
