**At Calvary . . . with CMC’s reflections on the book of Numbers and daily Bible reading** (Thank you for your contributions!)

**Numbers**

Numbers was quite a journey (no pun intended). During Israel’s 40 years in the wilderness, God established the temple system, ceremonial practices, and many of the cultural traditions that would shape the nation. Yet despite the consecration of the tribes and the countless offerings made before the Lord, the people continued to complain and rebel. Their story reminds us that human nature has not changed. The difference for believers today is the abiding presence of Jesus within us, empowering us to live differently.

The detailed record of tribal leaders and the numbering of Israel’s armies was not for God’s benefit. Rather, it demonstrated to the surrounding peoples—both in the wilderness and in the Promised Land—that Israel was no longer a collection of former slaves but a nation under God’s authority and command. It also served as evidence of God’s faithfulness in fulfilling His promise to Abraham that his descendants would become a great multitude.

One truth that especially stood out to me is that the failures of one generation do not have to define the next. Though the wilderness generation fell short, their children were able to move forward in faith and enter the Promised Land. That gives us hope for our own children and future generations—that they may be strong in the Spirit of God and accomplish great things for His kingdom. As Daniel 11:32 says, “the people who know their God shall be strong, and carry out great exploits.”

**11:34** “There are times when God grants a craving request to show us that physical desires don’t always satisfy and can harm.”

**16:3** “Korah said, “All the congregation is holy”, twisting a truth into license. Holiness is bestowed by God, not seized.”

**Chap. 22** “God’s right to bless Israel (Genesis 12:3). Balak believes curses can be bought; Balaam believes prophecy can be negotiated; both discover that God’s word is unchangeable (Isaiah 14:27).”

**23:5** “Then the LORD put a message in Balaam’s mouth - true prophecy comes directly from God, not from human invention or manipulation.”

**Chap. 28** “shows that ordered worship is God’s idea, not human invention.”

**Daily Bible Reading**

“What works well for me is to combine scripture reading and prayer. Morning prayer at wake up includes devotional prayer and praying a psalm. Evening prayer at bedtime includes devotional prayer and praying a psalm and reading of other scripture so you can ‘Meditate within your heart on your bed and be still. Selah’ [Psalm 4:4]. Using those times of day helps keep me regular in prayer and reading.”

“Good place to start is include Psalm 3 in morning prayer and Psalm 4 at evening prayer. Using the same psalm every day [for say a month] adds understanding and memorization.”

“Daily discipline: morning and evening moments with God create a steady flame.”

“Regarding our Bible reading practice, my wife and I usually do ours together after breakfast and we listen to an audio version of the daily passages while reading along. We’ve found hearing Scripture read by someone who powers through the names of people and places greatly aids our comprehension of the passages and takes the pressure off pronunciation. We often stop the recording and talk about what we heard and share thoughts and questions. This has been life-changing for us and we’re eager to pick up where we left off...even through Leviticus and Numbers!”

“Seeing that I am the only one living in the house now, I can just leave it on kitchen table, which makes it always ready to sit and read, especially first thing in the morning. Some days, God blesses me with additional sleep and that throws me off schedule, but my Bible always on the table reminds me He guides my day. There are some evenings I also end with reviewing my lesson for the day.”

“This is my first attempt at reading the Bible all the way through in my entire life. At first it was a struggle of finding a time that was quite enough to focus on reading the word. Based on my life's schedule it was the most logical to read in the morning before others get out of bed for breakfast. Which then meant I had to wake up earlier for this, since they get up early. I am also not what you consider a morning person. But after a few weeks of diligently waking up early with a glass of ice water and a hot cup of coffee, sitting in my chair, slowly waking up to the peaceful sounds of the morning like the birds chirping, and watching the sun come up. I realized what a gift the mornings are, and God blesses us with it everyday and I had been missing it. With being in that state of mind it helped me be eager to learn from God's Word. I read the daily passages and study notes. I journal about what I am thinking and learning about the passages. After 3 years, it as been interesting to go back and see where I was when I started and where I am today. The journey truly is beautiful. The word challenges me everyday to say to myself, am I a reflection of God's love to people. Everyday the word of God encourages me, it strengthens me that anything is possible with God even though I can't see it in my limited sight and understanding. Everyday the word aligns my attitude and heart with God's will. It is my life line, there is nothing else is this world I could say these thing about. There is only one manual to life. Reading through the Bible has been one of the greatest gifts I've received in my life. I have found nothing more life changing than this. It really has changed me in the way I walk in this world. My desire as grown so strong, that I can't wait for the next morning to read it. I also can appreciate the shorter readings as it helps you to really digest what you read, otherwise it can be easily confusing at times. I make sure to take my Bible on vacations to keep up with my morning routine. To learn from and rest in God's peace, that is always worth showing up for.”
