CMC’s reflections on the CMC Church Family Bible Reading – Deuteronomy & Joshua (Thank you for contributing! Let the following spur you on to continue reading with us!)

Deuteronomy
4:2 & 9 “Adding to His commands can lead to legalism and subtracting from them is disobedience. He reminds us to be careful and watch ourselves closely, and ‘do not forget the things your eyes have seen.’ When we remember what He has done, our fear and awe will not fade.”

Chap. 11 “This is what the LORD really wants from His people – their love. People choose to love the LORD or to not love Him. He has given us that free will option.”

29: 2-4 “Israel saw wonders, but they did not see them.
‘Now Moses called all Israel and said to them: “You have seen all that the LORD did before your eyes in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and to all his land—the great trials which your eyes have seen, the signs, and those great wonders. Yet the LORD has not given you a heart to perceive and eyes to see and ears to hear, to this very day.’

Spurgeon suggested three reasons why Israel, and those since them were blind to God’s truth.
· They never recognized their own blindness, thinking they could see.
· They never asked God for a heart to perceive.
· They resisted the little light that they had.

Do I learn from Israel’s history? How often do I resist God’s truth?”

Chap. 32 “sings the whole gospel in miniature: a perfect God, a wandering people, righteous judgment, persistent mercy, and a future hope when nations and Israel together rejoice in the Rock who saves.”

“The biggest thing that stuck out to me was just how God had power over everything, and how he clearly used it. But also, that a lot more people had a true fear of God that we often struggle to have now.”

“In Deuteronomy, I personally learned a lot about God’s unconditional love for us, and how He will always be there for us. It was great to read this book in the Bible, and really helpful because it reminded me of how much God is forgiving, loving, and understanding. It definitely reminds us of how Jesus went through all of the pain He went through for us, and to show how much He cares about us. The book also shows a lot about how we can always trust God in all of our plans, or *His* plans!

Joshua
6:10 “...do not say a word until the day I tell you to shout.’ Sometimes, we need to speak, and sometimes silence is very powerful; God may do His work through our silence.”

“The thing that has really been sticking out to me as I read in Joshua and the beginning of Judges is that God can use anyone to do great things for Him, and all the great things that great people do are all blessings from God.”

“In Joshua, I learned more about how important it actually is to have lots of faith, and trust in God, and God’s word. I think some people have a really hard time trusting what God will give to us and what will happen with His plans, and sometimes I struggle with this too, lots of people do. This book is a great reminder that God’s plan always works out if you trust in Him.”
